Community-Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a mutually beneficial partnership where urban consumers receive fresh, nutritious vegetables while helping to sustain the livelihoods and stewardship of regional farmers. In a CSA arrangement the farmer pre-sells “shares” in his or her farm’s upcoming harvest to individuals, families, and institutions in the city. *Hazon* means vision – Hazon’s mission is to foster a healthier and more sustainable Jewish community, as a step towards a healthier and more sustainable world for all. Hazon and Tikvat Israel are committed to recruiting a minimum of 75 shares / memberships to support the upcoming season. Tuv Ha’Aretz warmly welcomes Jewish and non-Jewish members.

Member Commitment

I, _____, (_____) commit to membership in Tuv Ha’Aretz, The Hazon CSA at Tikvat Israel with Calvert farm. As a member, I commit myself to supporting the farm with timely payments. In addition, I commit to pick up my weekly delivery at Tikvat Israel between 2 and 6:30 pm on Monday night. I understand that if I do not pick up my share it will be donated to a low-income family or an emergency food provider. As part of my membership I also agree to volunteer a minimum of 1 shift (per household) during the Tuv Ha’Aretz season.

The CSA Share

As a member of the CSA, I will receive a weekly share consisting of 6-8 vegetables. The shares will vary in size and weight depending on the time of the season. One aspect of CSA is that members

support their farmer by sharing in the inherent risks of agriculture (poor weather, drought, disease, early frost, crop failure and so on) and rewards (the bounty from a good season) involved in farming. CSA farmers purposely plan for such contingencies and use growing techniques that protect the harvest, minimize risk to members, and optimize the rewards: growing a wide variety of crops that thrive in different types of conditions; cover cropping, crop rotation, and irrigation. Moreover, the CSA builds relationships of trust between the farmer and community group. Members will get a wide variety of vegetables. Therefore, I understand this principle and agree that there is no guarantee on the exact amount or type of produce I will receive in my share. By participating in the CSA, I am supporting the local farmer as well as more equitable food distribution, and I am helping to create a more environmentally just, economically fair and healthy society.

Share Prices for Fall 2009 Season

Monday, October 5 – Monday, November 23 (Share Dates)

A “**FULL SHARE**” is full amount picked up once a week.

Produce Share: Farm fresh, locally grown, seasonal vegetables from Calvert Farm. The fruit will be either organic, organically grown or grown using IPM (Integrated Pest management); non-organic apples and peaches may also be included.

Egg Share: 1 dozen per week. The eggs are free range. Hens are kept separate from roosters.
